

The current grant situation is very confusing and we are aware that some businesses have not yet applied for money they are eligible for. I have tried to summarise it below:

Local Restrictions Grant – open This is for businesses in the hospitality, accommodation and leisure sectors that were trading throughout August, September and October. Additional Restrictions Grant - this covers 2 areas:

- Businesses mandated to close by Government on 5th November BUT without a rateable value for the property
- Businesses that supply the hospitality, accommodation and leisure sectors with or without a rateable value

- Tier 4 Local Restrictions Grant covers from 31st December if you have already received a grant payment under the earlier national lockdown scheme (for November) then you do not need to do anything, and the payments for Tier 4/3rd lockdown will be made automatically. If you haven't applied but think you should be eligible have a look at: http://www.rochdale.gov.uk/health-and-wellbeing/coronavirus/Pages/local-<u>restrictions-support-grant.aspx</u> . By successfully applying for the November grant, you will automatically start receiving the Tier 4/3rd lockdown payments.
- 3rd Lockdown grant for retail, hospitality and leisure this was announced earlier this week but we don't have any more information at this stage. As soon as we do, I will issue a further newsletter.

In all cases, the grants are **not** available to those who are self-employed and can make a claim through HMRC for the Self-Employed Income Support Scheme.

And finally – a reminder of the national lockdown rules:

The single most important action we are each being asked to take, is to stay at home, except for the following permitted reasons:

To shop for basic necessities, for you or a vulnerable person

- go to work, or provide voluntary or charitable services, if you cannot reasonably do so from home
- exercise with your household (or support bubble) or one other person, this should be limited to once per day, and you should not travel outside your local area.
- meet your <u>support bubble</u> or <u>childcare bubble</u> where necessary, but only if you are legally permitted to form one
- seek medical assistance or avoid injury, illness or risk of harm (including domestic abuse)
- · attend education or childcare for those eligible

If you leave home for a permitted reason, you should stay local, only leaving your local area for a legally permitted reason.

You cannot leave your home to meet socially with anyone you do not live with or are not in a <u>support bubble</u> with.
